### Course Aims

This module looks at the nature of abuse and which individuals may be at risk. It also explores measures for raising awareness, prevention, intervention, and what is involved during the investigation process.

High quality social care is imperative for people to live healthy and independent lives that are free from abuse and neglect. This module will promote best practice within your organisation and provide you with an auditable training record. The assessment scores will also enable you to target traditional face to face training on those individuals producing the lower assessment scores. This will enable your organisation to make better use of the resources available for training. In addition this the safeguarding module will impact on resource management as timely and well managed interventions can prevent higher and more costly support needs whilst achieving better outcomes for individuals.
